

67 th STCW Compliance Board meeting held on 08.01.2026		
S.No	Agenda	Decision Taken
1	Malpractice noticed on MTI Exit Exam at R.R. Marines Academy, Jaipur	PO, MMD Kandla gave the presentation and updated that the video analysis and document review are still in progress. The examination was successfully conducted under supervision. The board agreed that once the pending input and investigation report are finalized, appropriate actions will be taken. Decision: PO, MMD, Kandla recommendations were accepted.
2	Presentation on Port Security:	CISF has made presentation and introduced a 5-day course and same has been approved by Nautical wing of DGS. It was decided that the five-day CISF Security Familiarization Training Course for PSA personnel deployed in port security is approved by DG Shipping and shall be mandatory. The course will be conducted at five designated port locations with a batch size up to 40, minimum once a month, extendable as per demand. The course fee will be ₹1,000 per participant, with boarding and lodging to be arranged by the concerned port authorities. Training and evaluation may be conducted with adequate practical components. DG Shipping will issue a Merchant Shipping Notice authorizing CISF and prescribing timelines for completion as directed by MHA. CISF will share the final PPT and certificate format for record.
3	Conduct of Comprehensive Inspection Programme (CIP) for Maritime Training Institute (MTIs)	DDG Training updated that the draft Comprehensive CIP circular, for different courses, has been shared with all board members. The members will review the draft and provide suggestions by this week. After incorporating feedback, the draft will be published on the official website for one month to invite stakeholder comments. The committee will then finalize the CIP based on received inputs.
4	Review of legal matters in Training Division – updates thereof.	Legal Consultant updated that there is total 22 active cases. and one case from Shri Nandanam Institute has been added. Two reply affidavits have been prepared by MMD Chennai, one approved by DGS while the second is under review.
5	Confirmation of publication of results at every STCW compliance Board meeting:	DDG Training updated that the publication of examination results for October and November has been completed on schedule. Engineering results were declared in the last week of December, and nautical results were also published as per the planned timeline.
6	Grievance of Shri Karan Raj (INDoS No.19GL1736) from Samastipur, Bihar:	DDG Training updated that as per the previous meeting's direction, a show cause notice was issued to MTI, and their response has been received and forwarded to MMD Mumbai for examination.
7	Ministry of Land, Infrastructure, Transport and Tourism (MLIT) Tokyo JAPAN,	DDG Training updated that a presentation on the Training overview was made to the delegation, and discussions were held regarding shipboard training/CIP. The delegation communicated their plan to continue collaboration and indicated that they may consider adding 2-3 additional institutes in the coming year. For 2026. It was agreed that the Directorate will acknowledge MLIT's letter and express commitment to continued cooperation.
8	Discussion on Shipboard Training	The Board reviewed shipboard training based on 2023 data and noted that while most courses meet the prescribed benchmark, GP Rating and CCMC courses show significant shortfall. It was suggested by NA that institutes consistently below 70% placement, by particularly with large intakes, shall

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		be issued notices and intake reduction if performance does not improve.
