1. Introduction

The maritime industry plays a pivotal role in our economy, and fostering collaboration among its stakeholders is crucial for its growth and innovation. Under the guidance and vision of Shri Shyam Jagannathan (IAS), Directorate General of Shipping, and following several meetings with his esteemed office, a proposal was submitted to elaborate on the concept of this unique event.

In the annals of India's maritime history, the conception and successful execution of the National Maritime Games – 2025 stands as a watershed moment. Hitherto, despite India's expansive coastline, thriving maritime trade, and rich seafaring tradition, no structured national-level sporting platform existed to bring together the entire maritime fraternity under one banner of athleticism, camaraderie, and unity. It is with great pride and conviction that we record that, for the very first time, the Directorate General of Shipping (DG Shipping) has taken the initiative to conceptualize and execute a grand and inclusive maritime sporting event, setting a pioneering precedent for the future.

The National Maritime Games – 2025, envisaged as a pilot project, was successfully conducted in Mumbai under the leadership and aegis of the DG Shipping. This historic initiative brought together participants from all corners of the country, reflecting the true diversity and spirit of India's maritime domain. What began as a modestly planned event with limited participant slots soon evolved into a landmark gathering owing to the overwhelming response received from stakeholders across the maritime sector—training institutes, shipping companies, seafarers, port officials, and allied organizations. The initial plan to accommodate 50 teams per sport was revised to 100 teams, in response to the unprecedented enthusiasm witnessed. Similarly, the Marathon event alone attracted over 700 participants, transforming it into a symbol of unity and physical excellence within the maritime industry.

Initially, the idea was to organize zonal tournaments across the North, West, East, South, and North-East regions of India. However, in a meeting with key stakeholders on **26th December 2024**, it was decided to host the **National Maritime Games 2025** in Mumbai in the month of March, culminating with the **National Maritime Day Celebration** on **5th April 2025**.

This unparalleled response not only validated the necessity of such an event but also underscored the deep-rooted desire within the Indian maritime fraternity for collaborative, physical, and community-building engagements. The 14 disciplines chosen for the pilot edition spanned indoor and outdoor games, capturing the interests of all age groups and professional segments within the maritime sector.

2. Background

The National Maritime Games 2025 is a flagship initiative by the Directorate General of Shipping (DGS), designed to foster unity, wellness, and camaraderie across India's vibrant maritime sector. The key objectives are:

1	Engagement and Networking: Foster connections among stakeholders across the maritime industry.
2	Promotion of Health and Well-being: Encourage physical activity and fitness among professionals.
3	Showcase Maritime Culture: Highlight the rich history and contributions of the maritime sector.
4	Strengthen Team Spirit: Build teamwork and unity across various maritime entities.
5	Innovation and Growth: Encourage innovation and collective growth within the maritime industry.

Glimpse of the Maritime Games 2025

The Maritime Games 2025 was a significant event featuring 14 sports, executed over 12 days across four venues. Over 60 companies and 1,750 participants from Chennai, Cochin, Dehradun, Gujarat, and Maharashtra participated. The event, organized by K2K Director Mrs. Kiran Phadnis and her team, was a resounding success, demonstrating excellent coordination and networking.

The games commenced with an opening ceremony on March 23, graced by Dr. P.T. Usha as the Chief Guest, alongside senior industry dignitaries. The events were conducted with precision, thanks to certified umpires and referees from the State Sports Departments. Despite a last-minute venue change for the Maritime Run and Cyclotron due to delayed police permissions, the events were successfully relocated to the Domestic Port Terminal, with 700 participants promptly informed.

The Maritime Games 2025 successfully fostered networking, wellness, and industry bonding, setting a strong precedent for future events.

3. Vision for the Future: Establishing a Biennial National Maritime Games

- Buoyed by the resounding success of the pilot edition, the Directorate General of Shipping envisions institutionalizing the National Maritime Games as a biennial sporting extravaganza. The long-term objective is to foster a culture of physical fitness, discipline, sportsmanship, and brotherhood across the Indian maritime industry, while simultaneously aligning with national policies promoting wellness and sports culture.
- To this effect, the Directorate proposes to constitute a dedicated National Maritime Sports Committee, which will be entrusted with identifying suitable infrastructure in various maritime zones and coordinating the systematic organization of the games. It is envisaged that Maritime Training Institutes (MTIs), with their extensive physical



infrastructure—sprawling campuses, sports fields, swimming pools, and hostel accommodations—will serve as ideal venues for conducting zonal-level events.

- The biennial edition, proposed to be held every February, shall witness preliminary events commencing in mid-January across designated zones, culminating in a grand final hosted on a rotational basis by one of the zones. This rotational model will ensure equitable representation and participation, while also fostering regional maritime pride. Moreover, the list of sporting disciplines will be expanded to accommodate growing interest and inclusivity. The Directorate is committed to promoting gender parity, regional representation, and youth engagement through these games.

4. Transition from Maritime Games to National Maritime Games

From a singular national event, the vision is now to build a Zonal-to-National Games ecosystem.

- **Biennial Format:** National Games to be hosted every two years.
- **Zonal Championships:** East, West, North, and South regionals to feed into the national-level games.
- **Special Zone for Coastal area:** Since we need to sensitize to Naval business for coastal area. East Cost, West Cost and Island territory.
- **Strategic Impact:** Driving national pride, local economic growth, and holistic individual development through sports.

This transition also aims to:

- **Increase inclusivity** across the maritime sector.
- Enhance **regional representation** from all parts of the country.
- Boost **national visibility** of the event and the maritime community.
- Make **sports a unifying force** within the industry.
- Foster **greater engagement** among maritime stakeholders and youths.
- Create a more **comprehensive and inclusive sports platform** for all involved.
- Promote **collaboration** across different sectors, including ship management companies, crewing agencies, ports, training institutes, and legal firms.
- Create a more **comprehensive and inclusive sports platform** for all involved.

4.1. Strategic Plan & Stakeholder Involvement

To ensure a successful transition to the NMG format, key stakeholders include:

1. **Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports (MYAS):** Central coordinator providing policy support and national promotion.
2. **Sports Authority of India (SAI):** Offers funding, infrastructure, and technical expertise.
3. **Maritime Institutes & Merchant Navy Colleges:** Talent hubs for athlete development and training.
4. **State Governments & Local Authorities:** Support zonal events with venues, logistics, and awareness campaigns.
5. **Private Sector & Sponsors:** Provide financial support, training resources, and promotional partnerships.

4.2. Fund Raising & Financial Strategy

The pilot edition of the National Maritime Games was made possible through an innovative and collaborative funding approach. The Directorate, with proactive engagement, reached out to various maritime stakeholders, who extended generous support as sponsors. Their contributions exceeded INR 1 crore, thereby demonstrating the shared sense of ownership and commitment within the maritime community towards this noble initiative.



However, to ensure continuity, expansion, and sustainability, it is imperative that the Ministry of Ports, Shipping and Waterways (MoPSW) formally recognizes and institutionalizes the National Maritime Games. It is earnestly requested that the Ministry may kindly consider including the event in the annual budget allocations under the Ministry's purview, enabling structured and long-term financial support.

Furthermore, it is proposed that the matter be taken up with the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Government of India, so that the requisite infrastructure, logistical support, and additional funding mechanisms can be explored in collaboration with the National Sports Federations. Their engagement would not only elevate the stature of the Games but would also facilitate their alignment with national-level sporting norms and standards.

The DG Shipping firmly believes that institutional support from the Government will catalyze the emergence of the National Maritime Games as a flagship event, showcasing India's maritime strength, youth talent, and commitment to holistic development.

In Year 2025 the event was concluded with a budget of around Rs. 1.0+ Cr., wherein these funds were sponsored jointly from the below institutions. The summary of contributions received from various agencies is as below.

4.4 Planned Budget

The Maritime Games 2025 are set to be a landmark event, showcasing India's maritime prowess and promoting sportsmanship across various zones. The planned budget for the National Maritime Games includes several key components aimed at ensuring the successful execution of the event. We should plan this budget at National and Zonal level also.

4.4.1 Planned Budget at Zonal Level

As per transmission of maritime games, the National Maritime Games will be conducted among the zonal wines, therefore we need the sufficient budget for zonal games.

The above budget indicates the expected cost for a single zone. While the National Maritime Games 2025 were conducted at a single location with an expense of over ₹1 crore, we propose establishing six zones (Northern, Central, Eastern, Southern, Western, Northeastern) along with three special zones for the coastal areas (East Coast, West Coast, and Island Territory).

Therefore, a budget of ₹2.0 crore is required for each zone to conduct the planned games. This estimated amount was determined after accounting for the existing infrastructure available at the zonal MTIs and IMU

4.4.2 Planned National Games Budget

Considering the inclusion of numerous games along with sportsmen from all proposed zones, the significant participation of maritime sector business participants, and the ceremony involving top leadership of India, we need at least ₹5.0 crore.

4.4.3 Funding Sources

The success of the National Maritime Games relies on the active participation and support of various entities including **Shipping Companies, Ports, Logistics Companies, Maritime Training Institutes (MTIs), Recruitment and Placement Agencies**. These stakeholders play a crucial role in promoting the event, encouraging participation, and ensuring the smooth execution of the games.

a) Government Funding

- Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports (MYAS):** A significant portion of the budget should be allocated through the MYAS and SAI (Sports Authority of India) for logistics, infrastructure, and operational costs.
- State Government Contributions:** Local governments will contribute by providing venues, staff, and logistical support and the National Games location state will also contribute a sizable amount. We can also include the state government's departmental business promotion and advertisement.

b) Private Sponsorships and Partnerships

- Corporate Sponsorships:** Major corporations, especially those in maritime, logistics, and sports-related industries, can be tapped for funding.
- Media Partnerships:** Collaboration with TV networks, digital platforms, and news outlets for broadcasting rights.

c) Merchant Navy Colleges and Maritime Institutes

- Merchant Navy colleges and maritime institutes can contribute resources like venues, equipment, and expertise in exchange for brand visibility and involvement in training future maritime athletes.

d) Merchant Navy Alumni and Maritime Clubs Engagement

Engaging merchant navy alumni and maritime clubs for funding can approach to support.



e) Event Entry Fees and Merchandise

- **Entry Fees:** Competitors at zonal levels could pay an entry fee to cover some of the event costs.
- **Merchandise Sales:** Sale of official event merchandise (jerseys, equipment) could also generate revenue.

4.5 Games lineup and Target Participation

The National Maritime Games 2025 features 14 dynamic sports, including Athletics (100m and 4x100m), Carrom (Singles/Doubles), Cyclothon, Maritime Run, Cricket, Futsal, Badminton (Singles/Doubles), Table Tennis, Golf, Indoor Rowing, Chess, Swimming, Darts, and Pickleball. We will include additional sports, considering the maritime theme –

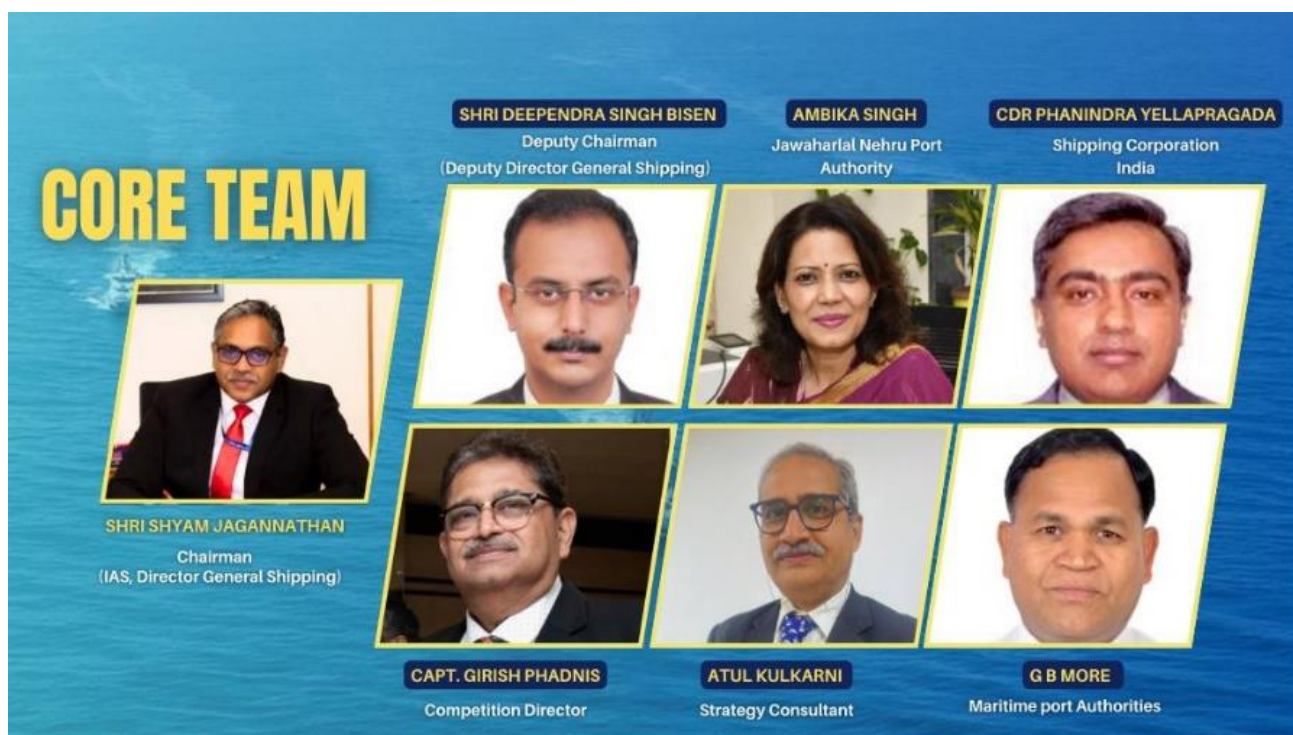

2. Sponsor details.

A total of 43 companies and institutions responded to the sponsorship appeal issued by the Directorate General of Shipping (DGS) office. A detailed list of confirmed sponsorships is provided below. Among these, 21 contributions were received from Maritime Training Institutes (MTIs).

However, from the ship management and shipping sector, only 9 RPSL-certified organizations extended their support. The remaining contributors were primarily from ports, logistics companies, and related sectors.

Given that this was a pilot initiative by the DGS, a broader industry response had been anticipated. One of the key challenges encountered was the limited preparation time. An event of this scale ideally requires a minimum of four months of groundwork and planning to ensure comprehensive participation and flawless execution.
